Here's how we suggest you proceed with this PRINT & GO activity:

1) Print out one copy of the Information Station Posters (pages 5-13). These posters each contain information about a day of Holy Week (plus the period between the Resurrection & the Ascension).

2) Tape up the Information Station Posters around your classroom, home, church, etc. For added fun, you can HIDE the Information Station Posters in the space (tape to the underside of a table, in a closet, taped to a ceiling, etc.). You want the Information Station Posters to function like learning stations sprinkled throughout your environment- you do NOT want them to all be in one spot to avoid kids congregating together. Remember- this is a HUNT!

3) You can have kids perform the hunt in teams or individually. Each team or individual completing the hunt will need one copy of the "Holy Week
Scavenger Hunt" worksheet at the back of this packet (page 14&15 or 17). Note: we provide TWO options of this worksheet- (answer matching or fill-in)


4) Before you begin, explain to the kids that the ANSWERS for the Holy Week Scavenger Hunt worksheet can be found across 9 Information Stations that are scattered/hidden throughout the space.

5) The **object** of the hunt is to visit all the Information Stations and accurately complete the "Holy Week Scavenger Hunt" worksheet.

6) At the back of this package you will find printable certificates that can be awarded to kids as they complete the hunt!

Way to Add Intrigue...

Make it a silent hunt! Before students begin, announce that no one is allowed to speak. Any communicating between partners or among teams must be in writing or with hand motions or lip reading.



HOLY WEEK SCAVENGER HUNT PALM SUNDAY



TRIUMPHAL ENTRY

Palm Sunday is also known as the Triumphal Entry. Jesus entered Jerusalem at the beginning of Passover Week, when a lot of Jewish people were visiting the city to celebrate. Passover is a Jewish holiday dating all the way back to the Exodus.

THE ULTIMATE SARIFICE

Jesus knew why He was really coming to Jerusalem. He knew the religious leaders would have Him killed on Passover in just a few days. He would be the ultimate sacrifice for our sins, and the people of Israel would no longer rely on sacrificing animals. Jesus knew He was the Messiah. The Triumphal Entry was a time when other people publicly acknowledged Him as the Messiah too.

MOUNT OF OLIVES

The Triumphal Entry didn't start at the gates of Jerusalem. It started on the Mount of Olives. Jesus and His disciples had been staying in Bethany, a town on the mount. There, Jesus told two of His disciples to go and find a donkey and her colt in the next town over.

When Jesus sat on the colt, the people didn't just lay palm branches in His path for the colt to step on. They also laid down their own cloaks. Such was a tradition during that time for parades of royalty. This is similar to a red carpet for celebrities today.

A MESSIANIC PROPHECIES FROM THE OLD TESTAMENT

The people treated Jesus this way because they believed He was indeed the Messiah. As He rode into Jerusalem, the people cheered Him with some Old Testament prophesies, which they knew applied to the Messiah. One prophecy was from Psalms 118:26: "Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord."



The religious leaders were angry when they heard the people shouting prophecies about the Messiah in reference to Jesus. They didn't believe Jesus was the Messiah and were upset with those that did believe. They told Jesus to "rebuke," or stop His followers from saying such things, but Jesus paid them no mind!

THE COLT OF A DONKEY

On Palm Sunday, Jesus also fulfilled the prophecy from Zechariah 9:9, which said the Messiah would come into Jerusalem riding on the colt of a donkey.

The Triumphal Entry actually happened in the late afternoon. Jesus and His followers did go into Jerusalem and visit the Temple courts. Later that evening, they went back to Bethany instead of staying in Jerusalem.



FIG TREE: A WARNING

On Monday morning, Jesus and His disciples were leaving Bethany. Jesus was hungry and went to a fig tree to pick its fruit. However, it wasn't producing figs. He then cursed the tree, and by the next morning it had almost completely withered. Jesus wasn't being cruel to a tree. He was making a point that as Christians we need to mature or "bear fruit." If we don't, like the tree, we will "wither spiritually" and not be valuable.

CLEANSING THE TEMPLE

Once in Jerusalem, Jesus became angry when He saw how the money changers and merchants were behaving in the Temple. They were selling animals to be sacrificed on the altar, but their focus was on the money, not the people wanting to make sacrifices to God. He turned over tables and destroyed property of people who cared more about finances than God's love.





RELIGIOUS LEADERS BEGIN TO FEAR

The religious leaders heard about this and realized the commotion had been seen by many, and word of it would travel far. They put the plan in motion to kill Jesus because they could see how the people loved Him. The religious leaders were fearful of Jesus taking away their power.

PARABLES



Jesus returned to Jerusalem after spending the night in Bethany. He was harassed by the religious leaders throughout the day. He stood His ground and told parables, or stories with hidden meaning to prove a point. The religious leaders understood from one story that they were at fault, or had done wrong. The didn't like this one bit!

Jesus warned that the religious leaders were hypocrites, and He told people not to be like them. This angered them further and inspired them to continue with their plot to kill Him.

THE WIDOW'S COINS

Jesus watched a woman put two coins in the Temple collection, probably not worth a penny today. Other rich people were putting in expensive items and large sums. Jesus pointed out to His disciples that the poor woman's gift was worth more to Him because she had given everything she had. The rich people instead had given their excess or left-over money.





THE GREEKS

Late in the day, Greek people asked to see Jesus. This was unprecedented, as Jesus had directed nearly all His teaching to the Jewish people. However, word of Him had travelled far. This is evidence of how He accepted all races and ethnicities.

THE OLIVET DISCOURSE

Jesus stopped with His disciples on the Mount of Olives to give a speech to them. He told them many signs of His Second Coming. Jesus also predicted the Temple would be torn down by Rome. This happened 40 years later. This important speech, knowns as the Olivet Discourse, can be found in Matthew 24, and people today read it closely, believing Jesus will return soon.



Jesus spent that Tuesday night somewhere on the Mount of Olives.

A SECRET MEETING



On Wednesday, Jesus spent most of the day teaching. Meanwhile, in a secret meeting, the chief priests discussed how Jesus was performing many miracles. Instead of believing in Him and seeing the miracles as a blessing, they were jealous of His power. The religious leaders already had power among the Jews and they saw Jesus as a threat to their power. Some thought Jesus would cause Rome would take away their power, but this was likely an exaggeration. They just didn't want to give up the power they had.

The leaders struggled to formulate a plan, however. They knew Passover was approaching and they didn't want to have Jesus killed on that day. They were afraid it would cause a riot, and they feared the people.

THE ULTIMATE SACRIFICE FOR MANKIND

The religious leaders also did not think Jesus was the Messiah. One reason is because most people thought of the Messiah as a political savior, rescuing the Jews from Roman rule. Another reason is that they likely thought they would be accepted by the Messiah, instead of being called hypocrites.

The high priest that year, Caiaphas, said something astonishing while helping plot the murder. He said that it is better to have one man die for the people than for the whole nation to perish. This was amazing because Jesus was about to be a sacrifice for everyone's sin.



A TRAITOR

The disciple Judas Iscariot solved the problem for them. Judas had changed his mind about Jesus. It is likely that he was one of the disciples who thought Jesus was coming to Jerusalem as a political Messiah, and he would seize power there. And once Judas realized Jesus didn't want earthly power, Judas didn't want to be one of His followers any longer.

The Gospel of Luke says that Satan entered Judas at this point. He discussed with the chief priests his willingness to betray Jesus, but only at a time and place when no crowds were around. They were delighted and laid out 30 pieces of silver for him. Judas agreed and began looking for an opportune moment.

HOLY WEEK SCAVENGER HUNT THURSDAY



PASSOVER

While Jesus was teaching, some disciples carried out plans to celebrate the Passover dinner that night. Jesus gave them explicit instructions, telling them to look for a man carrying a jug of water, and follow him into a house. There, the disciples were to tell the owner of that house that Jesus wanted to use his guest room to have Passover dinner with His disciples. All went as Jesus foretold.

A NEW COMMANDMENT

The Jewish Passover was actually the next day. However, Jesus knew His body would be in the grave by that point, so that is the reason they celebrated it on Thursday. It has become known as the Last Supper.

This day in Holy Week is often called Maundy Thursday. The word "Maundy" comes from the Latin mandatum, which means "commandment." It was on this night that Jesus gave the new commandment to His disciples: to love one another as He had loved them. This commandment today applies for all who love Jesus.






WASHING OF THE FEET

Before the meal started, Jesus offered another lesson in humility. He washed His disciples' feet, which was considered a job for the lowest servant. It was also a sign of how He would cleanse all from sin who believed in Him.

THE LAST SUPPER

The Last Supper is what formed the sacrament of Holy Communion. Jesus knew He was about to be arrested that night and killed the following day. He therefore used bread as a symbol of His body, which was about to be "broken" for us. He used wine as a symbol of His blood, which was about to be "spilled" for us.







THE GARDEN OF GETHSEMANE


They went after dinner to the Garden of Gethsemane. Jesus asked the disciples to stay awake and pray with Him, but they kept falling asleep. Jesus felt sorrowful and prayed to the Father, committing Himself to do the Father's will. Finally, Judas arrived with armed guards hired by the high priests. He betrayed Jesus by kissing Him. The kiss showed the armed guards which of the men in the garden was Jesus.

PETER'S DENIAL

The disciples ran from the scene, fearing they would be arrested also. Just like Jesus had predicted, Peter denied knowing Jesus three times before a rooster crowed. Jesus was taken to the home of Annas, father-in-law of the high priest Caiaphas. There His trial began.



THE TRIALS OF JESUS



Pilate's wife was likely a believer in Jesus. She begged Pilate not to condemn Jesus because she'd had disturbing dreams about Him early that morning. Pilate tried just about everything to release Jesus, but the crowd was so worked up that he gave in to their demands.


During these trials, Jesus was beaten, scourged (whipped so that He bled), and mocked. It was tradition to release a criminal at Passover, so Pilate asked the people to free Jesus. The people however, chose to release a thief named Barabbas instead.

THE CRUCIFIXION

Jesus was then sentenced to death by crucifixion, and forced to carry His own cross to the place where he would die. One man was ordered to help Jesus carry the cross after Jesus became too weak. His name was Simon the Cyrene.

Jesus spent about three hours on the cross and was crucified with two other criminals. One was very sorry for his sins. Jesus told the man he would join Jesus in paradise at the day's end. Jesus spoke seven times. With His final words, Jesus cried out to God and committed His spirit to His Father.





MIRACLES

Around the time Jesus died, the sky grew dark. By three o'clock, it was dark as a night sky. An earthquake also shook the ground and opened nearby tombs of the dead. After the resurrection, holy people who had been buried were seen walking about Jerusalem.

The final miracle of that day involved the curtain in the Temple. While over a foot thick and very tall, it was torn from top to bottom. This symbolized that people could now communicate directly to God and didn't have to rely on a priest going into the holiest part of the Temple.

BURIAL IN A BORROWED TOMB

A believer named Joseph of Arimathea approached Pilate for the body of Jesus, and he and a friend named Nicodemus laid Jesus inside a tomb belonging to Joseph.



HOLY WEEK SCAVENGER HUNT SATURDAY



A QUIET DAY

After the death of Jesus, the disciples were in hiding. They were afraid that what happened to Jesus might happen to them. The only disciple to attend the crucifixion had been John, and one of the seven things Jesus said on the cross was that John should take care of His mother, Mary.

THE SABBATH

Saturday was also the Jewish Sabbath, a day of rest. The women who loved Jesus wanted to tend to His body but would not do work on the Sabbath. So, they rested and waited until they could attend to his body on the next day.

The streets were likely quiet. The joyful people who called Jesus the Messiah on Palm Sunday went back to their homes, very disappointed. The question is often raised of how people could call Jesus the Messiah on Palm Sunday and scream "crucify him" over and over on Friday. The answer is that they were likely not the same people. Those who accompanied Jesus into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday were from the towns and villages. Those shouting for crucifixion on Friday were the city dwellers who were seen as more sophisticated and enlightened. They were strongly influenced by the religious leaders who plotted to kill Jesus.





TOMB GUARDED BY SOLDIERS

We do know from the account in Matthew that the high priests became afraid of grave robbery on Saturday. They thought Jesus' disciples could rob the tomb and then say He rose from the dead. This rumor of Jesus arising from the dead was circulated, but it is unlikely that many believed it. The disciples themselves were confused.

Pilate posted guards around the tomb. A big rock had already been placed in front of the tomb, but Pilate ordered that the stone be sealed.

HOLY WEEK SCAVENGER HUNT RESURRECTION SUNDAY



AN EMPTY TOMB

At dawn, Jesus' closest female friends approached the tomb where He had been placed. Mary Magdalene was named in three Gospels. Other women are also named in Mark and Matthew. They wanted to clean Jesus' body and prepare it in the traditional way for burial.

Upon arrival, they saw that the big stone placed in front of the tomb had been moved away. They also saw that Jesus' body was not in the tomb. Very upset, Mary Magdalene hurried to find Peter and John and tell them the body had been taken. The two disciples ran to the tomb and also found it empty.


JESUS' FIRST APPEARANCE

Mary arrived back at the tomb after the disciple had left and went back to their homes. She saw angels dressed in bright white. The guards saw them and were so afraid they fainted.

The angel told Mary Magdalene that Jesus was not inside—that He had risen. She saw Jesus standing outside the tomb but thought He was the gardener. She tried to hug Jesus, who said something mysterious. He said she should not touch Him as He had not yet ascended to His Father.

He told her to tell the disciples He was alive and that He would meet them all in Galilee.

The women went back to Jerusalem and told the disciples who were still in hiding. They didn't respond well, thinking it was nonsense.





ROAD TO EMMAUS

Jesus then appeared to two friends of the disciples on the road to Emmaus. He explained the resurrection and the words of the Old Testament prophets to them, but they didn't recognize Him. He finally revealed Himself when they sat down to eat, but to their amazement He disappeared from their sight.

The only disciple who saw Jesus on Resurrection Sunday was Simon Peter. However, there is only a mention of it in the Book of Luke and no account of what actually happened.

HOLY WEEK SCAVENGER HUNT ASCENSION DAY

A RESURRECTED BODY



Quite a few people saw Jesus alive in the 40 days between His resurrection and His ascension into heaven.

Jesus had appeared to the two men on the road to Emmaus the day before. He had walked with them and explained the gospel. On Monday, these two men found 10 of the disciples together. They explained what had happened. While they were speaking, Jesus appeared to them all. The disciples were astonished and afraid, thinking He was a ghost.

To show them He was not a ghost, He asked for something to eat. They gave Him broiled fish, which He ate in front of them. He let them touch His hands and side. He breathed on them and told them to "receive the Holy Spirit."

DOUBTING THOMAS

The disciple who had not been there was Thomas. The others tried to tell him, but he declared that unless he could touch Jesus' wounds, he would never believe it. Eight days later, Jesus appeared and made a special point to let Thomas touch His wounds. Jesus said in the future, people who believed without all that evidence would be blessed. That's us!





THE GREAT COMMISSION

Jesus appeared several other important times after His resurrection. Once, He cooked fish for the disciples on the beach in Galilee and led them to a miraculous catch of hundreds of fish. He appeared on a Galilean mountain before the disciples, and this is where he gave the Great Commission. The Great Commission was a command for His disciples to preach the gospel to everyone.

Jesus appeared to 500 people at one time, and that is recorded in 1 Corinthians 15.

THE ASCENSION

The Ascension itself occurred on the Mount of Olives with the 11 disciples present. Jesus blessed them, answered some questions, and gave some instructions on what to do next. Then He was lifted up in a cloud and taken out of sight. The disciples were still staring into the sky while He was going, when suddenly two men in white clothing stood near them.

Some say these men were angels. Others say they were Elijah and Moses, who had been seen with Jesus during His ministry by three disciples. The men swore that Jesus would come back in the same way they saw Him go into heaven.
